example 1: Facebook's new data center in New Albany, Ohio



About 1 million SF


\$ 750 million cost over 2-year construction period

\$ 244 million in local construction spend

1,200 construction workers earned \$ 78 million in wages

Across the street, Google is planning a \$ 600 million, 275,000 SF data center on 440 acres.

example 2: Over \$10 Billion invested in 6 Google Data Centers



America's top *Investment Heroes* are Tech Firms

Tech invested **\$70 billion** in 2019 – more than energy, telecom, pharma, or manufacturing.

That tech investment will continue, with increasing American appetites for cloud storage of data for multimedia, autonomous vehicles, genomics, AI, and other emerging industries.



The Challenge: To attract a **billion-dollar data center**, Pennsylvania needs a **targeted sales tax exemption**

No enterprise data centers have located in Pennsylvania.

Pennsylvania's current sales tax exemption is capped, and is allocated among those *who already have data centers here*.

PA's Response: Enact a sales tax exemption targeted to *incremental*, large-scale data center investments, using *incremental* analysis:

Virginia's Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shows Virginia recovered **\$1.09 in state tax revenue** for every dollar of exempted tax (2017).

Data centers generate **over \$300 million in local tax revenue** for Loudoun county – funding services *and offsetting residential property taxes*.

Mangum's 2020 Study: "the 'cost' of the State data center incentive is **only 10 percent of the amount of State sales tax revenue exempted.**"
